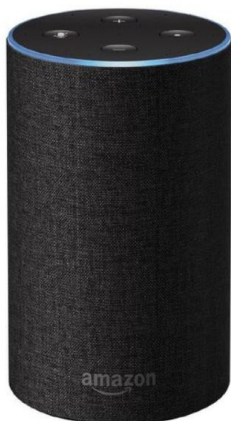
June Meeting

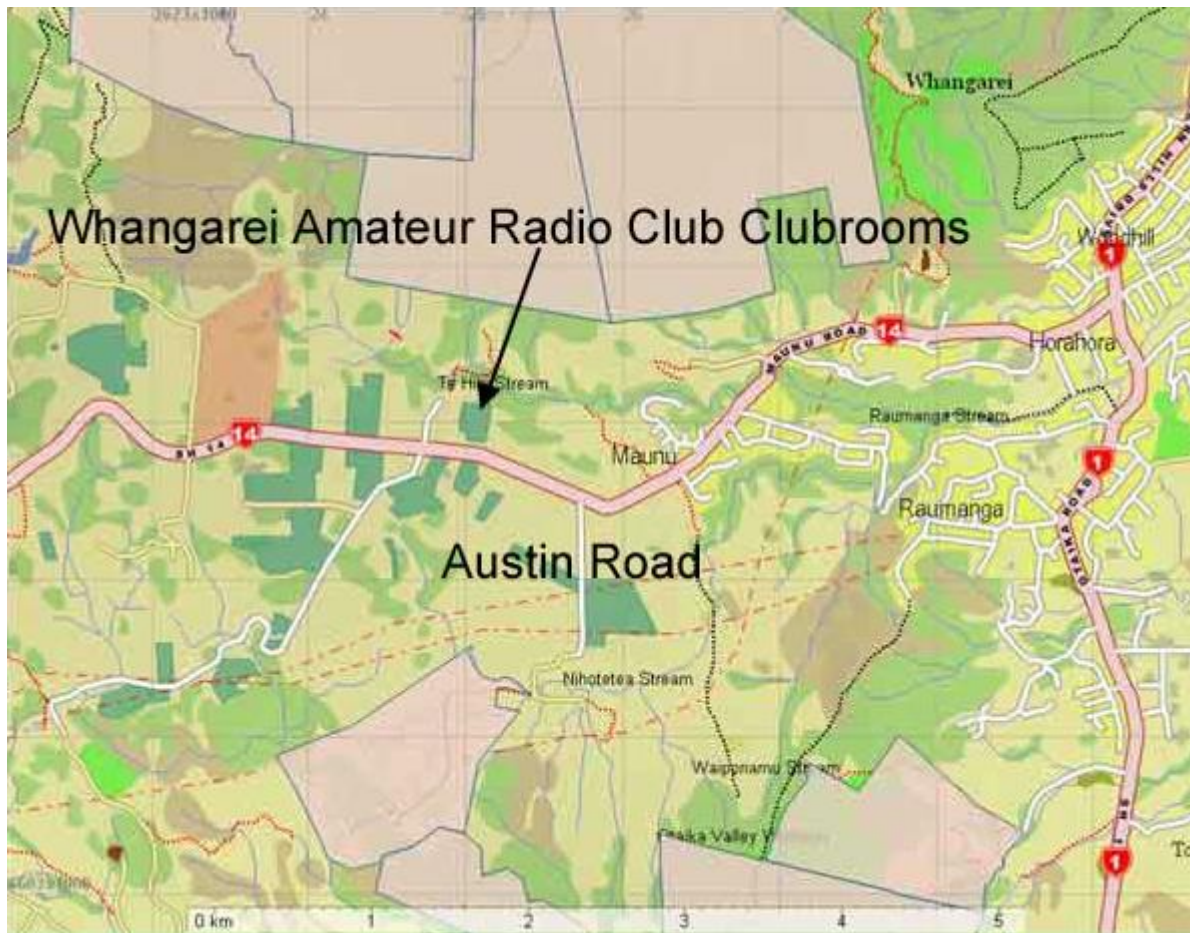
Newsletters

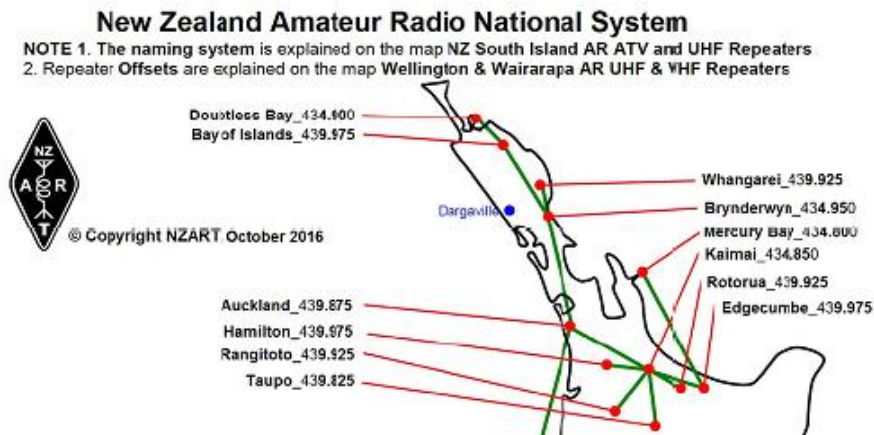
This section is followed by visitors to the Auckland region. Any visitors can call-in and let the Auckland people know they are here.

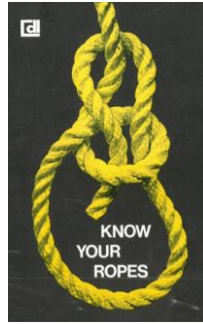
Club Fees

Know Your Ropes



KNOW YOUR ROPES, TIP No. 27

When joining two ropes together (in a towing harness, for example), protect each rope from contact with the other either by inserting protective packing pieces of canvas or rags etc., or with metal thimbles. This is absolutely vital when a fibre rope is to be joined to a wire rope. Never join a left-hand-laid rope to a right-hand-laid rope (The difference between the two rope types can be ascertained by holding them side by side. If the two sets of strands are parallel, the ropes are of similar lay.)

KNOW YOUR ROPES, TIP No. 28

Be sure and store all cordage (even synthetic) away from strong chemicals. Remember that nylon is attacked by most organic acids, and polyester by most alkalis. Natural fibre rope is attacked by most strong chemicals. If you think a rope may have been attacked by chemicals, hose it down with cold fresh water, and test the portion suspected of damage. Polyethylene and polypropylene are very chemical resistant, but even these can be weakened by contact with strong solvents—especially if hot.

KNOW YOUR ROPES, TIP No. 29

If you plan to leave a rope under tension for an extended time (for example a mooring spring) it is best to use one of the continuous fibre ropes. Staple fibre rope (i.e. rope in which the fibres are of short lengths) may exhibit a phenomenon called 'creep'. This means that the fibres may gradually slide apart causing permanent stretch and sometimes even breakage. Rope showing this tendency least are nylon (which will stretch a lot) and polyester (Terylene). If a nylon spring is used, it should be regularly checked for stretch abrasion. (See Tip No. 21.)

KNOW YOUR ROPES, TIP No. 30

It is very important to remember that both polyethylene and polypropylene are *thermoplastic* ropes . . . that is, they soften with heat. While it is unlikely that you have a boiler room on your boat, nevertheless there are plenty of places where you could subject these ropes to great heat. Letting your polypropylene anchor warp run over a metal fairlead, for example, can easily build up sufficient frictional heat to fuse and damage it. Pinching sheaves or jammed pulleys can also cause this. But probably the worst cause is allowing your warp to slip on your anchor winch. Think of the money you have tied up in your warp, your pick and your boat . . . and how easily you could lose the lot . . . and even your *life*. It takes just one small patch of damage in your warp.
